

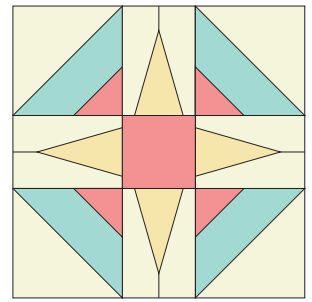

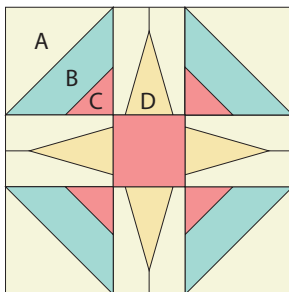

Finished Block Size 6" x 6"



## Requirements

- # 1 square - 10" x 10" (fabric A)
- # 1 rectangle - 4" x 8" (fabric B)
- # 1 square - 6" x 6" (fabric C)
- # 1 square - 10" x 10" (fabric D)



## Cutting Instructions

From fabric A cut:

- ✂ 2 squares - 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"
- ✂ 8 rectangle - 1 1/4" x 2 3/4"

From fabric B cut:

- ✂ 2 squares - 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"

From fabric C cut:

- ✂ 4 squares - 1 1/2" x 1 1/2"

- ✂ 1 square - 2" x 2"

From fabric D cut:

- ✂ 4 template D

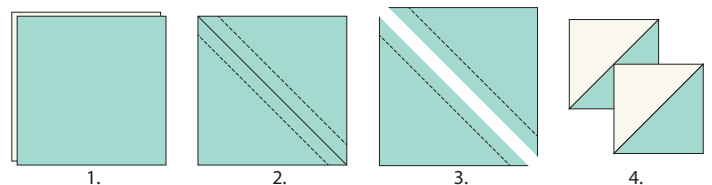
## Preparation

1. Draw a diagonal line on wrong side of fabric A - 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares and 4 fabric C - 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares.

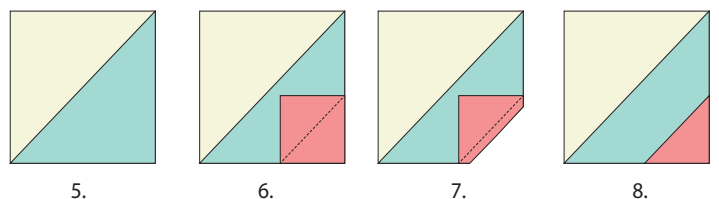
## Block Assembly

### Corner units

1. Place a fabric A - 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" square and a fabric B - 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" square right sides together.
2. Sew 1/4" on either side of the drawn line.
3. Cut on the drawn line. Press to the darker fabric. Trim half square triangle (HST) unit to 2 3/4" x 2 3/4" square.
4. Yields 2 - HST units. Make 4 in total.



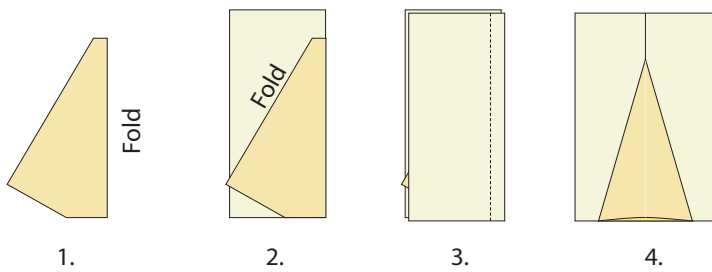
5. Select a HST unit.
6. Place a fabric C - 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" on the corner of a HST unit.
7. Sew on the drawn line.
8. Trim leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press corner triangle outwards.



9. Make 4 corner units in total.

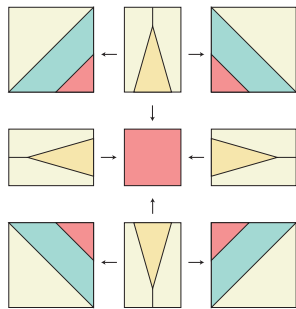
**Folded triangle unit**

1. Fold fabric D piece, wrong sides together, in half lengthwise.
2. Position a folded fabric D piece on fabric A - 1 ¼" x 2 ¾" rectangle.
3. Place a second fabric A - 1 ¼" x 2 ¾" rectangle on top, right sides together. Sew a ¼" seam through all layers.
4. From the right side, refold fabric D piece so the fold is lined up with the seam line. Press the seam allowance open to create a triangle.
5. Make 4 folded triangle units in total. Unfinished folded triangle unit size - 2" x 2 ¾"

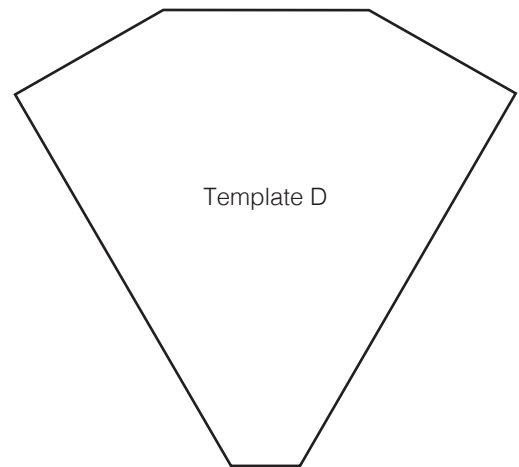


**Finishing the block**

1. Arrange units and sew rows.
2. Sew rows together. Press in direction of arrows.



Seam allowance included
