

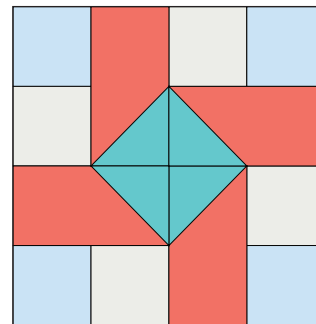

Finished Block Size 6" x 6"



## Cutting

Fabric A

✂ Cut 4 squares 2" x 2" for flip and sew in the center

Fabric B

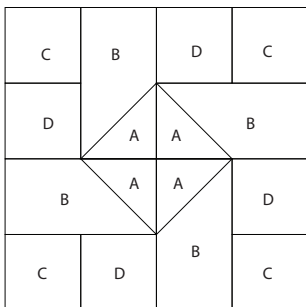
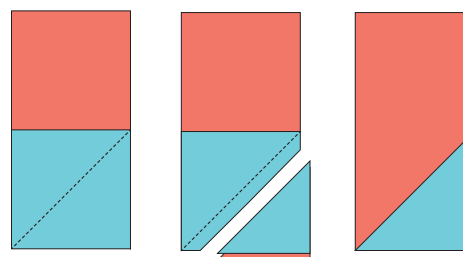
✂ Cut 4 rectangles 2" x 3 1/2"

Fabric C (background)

✂ Cut 4 squares 2" x 2"

Fabric D

✂ Cut 4 squares 2" x 2"

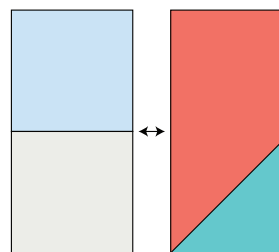


## Block Assembly

### Unit 1

1. Draw a line on the wrong side of all fabric A squares
2. Place fabric A onto the end of fabric B, right sides together. Note direction of line. Sew on the line.
3. Press fabric A towards the outside to check you covered all of fabric B.
4. Open fabric A to a square again and trim away excess.
5. Press fabric A back into place.
6. Make 4 of these.

7. Sew a fabric C and a fabric D square together.
8. Sew to the unit 1.
9. Make 4 of these measuring 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"



10. Lay out the 4 units into a 4-patch and sew together
